Labor Day Campout 2014

The SFFMC campout will once again be in the redwoods at the Boulder Creek Scout Reservation—the same place as this year's July 4th campout. It's about a mile from Boulder Creek, off Bear Creek Road. The address is 250 Scout Ranch Road. See the attached flyer for a map.

DATES: Camp is three nights: starting 2:00 PM, Friday, August 29 thru 11:00 AM on Monday, September 1. Note the new 11:00 AM checkout time.

New Rates: Adults: \$18/night per person, kids under 16: \$8/night per person, up to two kids in a family. Additional kids in the same family: free. Day use: \$10/person.

REGISTRATION: No advance registration. Register at camp. First-come, first-serve for campsites and tent cabins. The 17 tent cabins can usually accommodate all who want them.

SPECIAL NOTE: We have a new ranger for this campout, since our longtime Ranger and SFFMC member, Bob Keller, died last September. Please cooperate with the new ranger on any different procedures that he may require.

Activities

JAMS AND WORKSHOPS: Informal jams in the daytime and around the campfires at night, two nights of open mics, and varied workshops. We're planning workshops on songs Faith sang, songs by and about Bob Keller, *Rise Up Singing*, sea songs, two and three-chord songs, and many more. Some suggestions: songs of the Carter family, ukuleles, Bill Staines, Tom Paxton, Hank Williams, and instrument instruction.

Anyone can lead a workshop. If you'd like to lead one, or have topic ideas, e-mail Phyllis at folkniked@earthlink. net or sign up at camp at the workshop bulletin board near the registration table.

OPEN MICS: The second and third nights of camp, about 8:00 PM at the main outdoor amphitheater. A sign-up list will be at the registration table.

Swimming: Bring your swimsuit! Labor Day weekend is usually great weather for swimming. We plan to have the required lifeguard and open the pool on the camp's second and third days. Check pool hours when you arrive. (Labor Day's pool hours are different from July 4th's pool hours.)

POTLUCK: Saturday night, 6:30 PM at the outside dining area near the kitchen. We can use the camp's kitchen—with refrigerator and freezer, stove, oven and microwave—to store and heat potluck food. Also available: plates, silverware, pans, and serving utensils. All dishes, pots and pans and other utensils used must be washed afterwards. Label any leftovers you want saved. IMPORTANT: We must keep the kitchen clean if we want to continue using it; this is a do-it-yourself chore for anyone who uses the kitchen. If you use the kitchen,

Musical meetings of the San Francisco Folk Music Club are held every second and fourth Friday at Cyprian's ARC, 2097 Turk Street (at Lyon), San Francisco. Singing and jamming start at 8:00 p.m.; we start clean-up at 11:30 and need to leave by midnight. Two of the rooms require earlier leaving times. Bring finger-food snacks and beverages if you can. Guests are always welcome, and no one is expected to "perform." Cyprian's charges us rent; we ask those who can to donate \$5 to \$10 per evening, but if you can't donate, we still want you to join us!

Indie-folk-rock group, Alzara & Brother Spellbinder (www.brotherspellbinder.com) will have an EP coming out June 15 called Lovers & *Madmen*. The EP will feature four original songs by Alzara with Brother Spellbinder and two songs recorded by Alzara previously. The daughter of Dave Getz, longtime drummer for Big Brother and the Holding Co., Alzara grew up in a rock-n-roll scene, acquiring a taste for the spotlight and a love of lost souls living in the fringes between the sublime and disintegration. She formed recent group Brother Spellbinder with guitarist Jamie Wilson. Steeped in deep roots and fried in folk, guitarist, dedicated fisher and caver Wilson mixes in a dollop of gristle and a spoonful of sugar. Dale Carlson joined the brigade in late 2013 and adds her supersonic skills in sax, flute, harmonica, and pennywhistle. A musical savant, albino and transgender, Alzara never settles for the mundane. Additional rotating members include the blithe-fingered harpist Eri, Grammy-nominated fiddler Cal Murasaki, and bassist Jeremy Nelson.

Blind Lemon Pledge (aka James Byfield) is proud to announce the release of his new CD Evangeline. This 10-song album of all original material is a musical journey through the various styles of blues and Americana that have influenced Blind Lemon Pledge over the years. It includes "Brimstone Joe," a New Orleans homage; "Language of Love," a salsa-influenced upbeat song about Puerto Rico; "Midnight Assignation," a hard-driving pub-rock number; and "Buley's Farm", a surprising take on the prison and work gang songs recorded by John Lomax. Also included are two heartfelt love ballads, a Jump Jive number a la Louis Jordan, a swing tune in the Cole Porter vein, a jazz/blues song, and finally, the title song "Evangeline", a mournful deep blues number with steel slide guitar.

PATRICE HAAN

We Must Be Arrows Tuxedo Records, 2014; www.tuxedorecords.com

Patrice Haan, a Canadian-born, Oakland-based harper, singer, and songwriter, recently released her third solo album, *We Must Be Arrows,* on the independent Tuxedo Records label. It follows her two earlier solo albums, 2011's *Bluest Blue* and 2005's *Headed Home,* as well as two albums of standards from the Great American Songbook with her husband, guitarist and singer Tony Marcus, as the duo Leftover Dreams.

Recorded, mixed, and mastered in Berkeley at Derek Bianchi's MuscleTone Studios and featuring Patrice's spare and always tasteful piano- and harp-based accompaniment (supplemented by a crew of local musicians on cello, tuba, guitar, and harmony vocals) to her lovely contralto voice, the new album features 14 originals, including two a cappella pieces and a poem set to music. Personal favorites include "Angel of Music," an a cappella song featuring lovely four-part counterpoint and harmony lines, "Tea Time," a celebration of the grand British/Canadian tradition of an afternoon "cuppa" with a whimsical harp-and-tuba (!) accompaniment, "Mrs. Collinson's Piano," a homage to Haan's early-childhood exposure to music at school and at home, and "Here Within My Song," a haunting love ballad. Compelling vocals; recommended.

PAT LAMANNA *Full Circle: Songs of Peace and Love* 2009; www.patlamanna.com

When Pat Lamanna steps up to the mic at People's Music Network gatherings or elsewhere, folks always pay extra attention. They've learned to expect something special from Pat—songs that are thoughtful, touching, often funny, never disappointing. Yes, she writes great lyricdriven songs and she performs them beautifully. You'll probably want to listen to this recording many times.

From Pete Seeger: "You should write more songs!" From Sonny Ochs: "Really listenable songs that actually say something worth hearing." And there are many more quotations like these about her work.

This one-hour gem of a CD has 16 fine, very singable numbers, expertly performed by Pat and a dozen other talented musicians. Among them: "We Will Survive," which is irresistibly optimistic despite it all. There's the fun and funky "UU Blues." "Sing to the Mountains" and "Peace Pilgrim" are wise and inspirational. There's the delightful prison-improvement song, "Paint it Pink," and the cheerful "Down Through the Years." "Gather in the Warmth" is about the comfort of community. "Good Ship Beagle" is a toe-tapping, amiable celebration of evolution and science. There are "Stories," a poignant examination of the myths and legends that govern our warring planet, "Full Circle," a satisfying number, no matter where you are in your personal circle of life, and more.

It's a real pleasure to hear Lamanna in person and a treat to have this CD to tide one over between her performances. *Full Circle* is available from CD Baby, as is her more recent recording, 2012's *Do I Know My Song Well Enough to Start Singing Yet?* Music samples, videos, and more information about Pat and her music are available at her website.




Hugo Glanville says:

This is a trad song as far as I can tell—collected by Ralph Vaughan Williams—the traditional tune is shared somewhat operatically here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=rKSdeqrUg10

I believe the verses I sing were set in order by a member of Oxford City Morris Men to tell more of a story rather than just a random wishlist as sung by Piers. I parodied another inferior verse to come up with the final peace verse and set it in modern times to ensure a more emotional connection with lubricated singers. I learned it from Steven Levine of Ramsey's Braggarts Morris Men. He insisted that I sing the verses in the order he shared them to, as he put it, "tell a story."

Louis Killen sang it as "The Topman and the Afterguard." The Canadian Army has it in their songbook as "The Subaltern's Lament."

make sure to clean up after yourself.

HIKING: Several hiking trails begin at the camp: a selfguided historical trail about 3.5 miles long, and a nature trail about 2.5 miles long, among others.

Facilities

Camp capacity is several hundred people, so there is plenty of room. Many campsites have fire pits, and there is usually firewood available. Near the kitchen is an outdoor dining area and deck, picnic tables and umbrellas (and a machine with free ice).

Also nearby is the swimming pool, eight tent-cabins with cots, and a bathroom with showers and flush toilets. At the bottom of the hill by the parking lot is Cubland, a large flat site for tents; bathrooms with flush toilets and running water are nearby. RVs are welcome; they park in the parking lot.

Tent campers, we may not drive directly into campsites. Park vehicles in the parking lot or temporarily alongside the paved road and use provided carts to take gear the short distance to the campsites.

The camp has neighbors directly across Bear Creek, so any music near the creek after 10:00 PM—the usual curfew for noise—needs to be quiet. If you plan to sing late, please locate your circle as far from Bear Creek as possible, and at a distance from the Ranger's house.

Pitching In

Everyone over 12 years old (except day-use attendees) does an hour of camp duty: registration and parking, cleanup after the potluck; camp cleanup; or traffic control on the last day. Please sign up for a chore at the registration table as soon as possible after arriving. And please show up for your chore. If you can't, please leave a note at the registration table so we can cover the time.

If you arrive early (before 2:00 PM Friday, August 29), you can help post signs, register campers or direct parking. Contact Phyllis Jardine at folkniked@earthlink.net if you can come early and help out. Or just volunteer when you arrive. This counts as your regular chore.

Wiley (Clem) Small 1932-2014

"Music is just happiness searching for your ears."—M. Missouri Clem

Clem Small, longtime SFFMC member and folk festival promoter extraordinaire, died April 25, 2014 at age 82, while splitting wood in his front yard.

Clem was born Wiley Clemon Small to Laura Bouldin Small and Nobel Beasley Small, at Bell Memorial Hospital, Kansas City, Nov. 27, 1932. He was the youngest of seven children and was raised on a small farm in Independence, Missouri. He had two early interests: music and things technical, especially radio, and was part of a band while in his teens.

Early adult experiences included the Army and many knowledge quests that resulted in a B.S., M.Ed., M.A., and Ph.D. in Psychology from the University of Missouri.

Two children, Cynthia and Matthew, were born during his first marriage. The family moved to Hayward, California, where Clem took a position in psychology at California State University.

Clem married Pamela Long Claus in 1981 and became head of a household of six children, including an 8-year-old son whom he raised as he had raised his own children. He taught his children many things, both practical and impractical.

Clem retired as Professor of Psychology at California State University, Hayward, in 1985. Retirement led to a burst of creative energy as he became a writer, continued his vocations as tinkerer and inventor, and pursued his many musical interests as he supported and followed Pam while she pursued her career as a scientist, from San Francisco to Vermont, then to Montana, then Tennessee and then back to Montana.

Wherever they landed, Clem and Pam became part of the heart of the local acoustic music community. He was the creator and catalyst of many musical groupings, organized festivals in California, Vermont and Montana and was a valued participant in many others. His life was filled with adventure as he and Pam shared music, traveled the world and reflected on humanity, life and love.

He seemed to know the words to every country tune written before 1960. You could hardly stump him, so his friends took to claiming—only halfjokingly—that he was their own personal "landfill of lyrics," where durable old songs with a lot of heart and life still in them had been recklessly thrown by a society in too much of a hurry, only to be mined back out and resurrected by Clem to shine like they did in their glory days.

Clem had deep gratitude for his life. He saw his life as a continuum that death was a necessary part of and it united him with humanity. He was simply honored to be part of that continuum. Most of all, we are honored to have had Clem as the vital part of our own versions of the Continuum.

Clem, a.k.a. M. Missouri Clem, was the classic definition of a consummate musician. He didn't leave home without his guitar very often and you'd often find him playing it when you showed up at his and Pam's house for an unexpected visit. He went "with his boots on," in the middle of Montana, chopping wood for the stove, living the life he loved. M. Missouri Clem was quite a man.

Clem is survived by his wife, Pamela Small (Corvallis), biological children Matthew Small (San Mateo, Calif.), Cynthia (Small) Blank (Cupertino, Calif.), and acquired children Wendi (Claus) Fawns (Corvallis), Matthew Claus (Billings), Sarah Claus (Newbury Park, Calif.), and Benjamin Claus (Portland, Conn.).

Clem left clear instructions on his passing: "A party with food and drink and no sad songs ... a simple and happy event." A memorial of songs and memories was held at his scheduled workshop at the San Francisco Free Folk Festival on June 22.
